EGYPT PLANS NEW SUSTAINABLE CITY

A NEW green, multi-purpose complex for Nasr City in Cairo, has been unveiled by French studio Vincent Callebaut Architects.

The Paris-based designer has revealed plans for The Gate Residence, a new development composed of 1,000 apartment units with a health club and spa, fitness centre, business centre, restaurants, cafes, retail spaces and a medical centre.

The project, designed to obtain a LEED Gold Plus rating, will feature a solar roof, green terraces, sky villas, vertical Gardens and solar heating tubes.

Vincent Callebaut also built structural Megatrees to function as passive cooling systems, inspired by the technology behind wind catching towers (Malqaf) originally developed by Ancient Egyptians. ■
